<b>AB 2203</b>		
Garcia	Requires that any woman seeking an annual gynecological examination or family planning appointment be provided with an information sheet on HIV and AIDS. The sheet shall include a clearly marked place where a patient can sign, a description of the HIV and AIDS tests, risk factors, and modes of transmission. <b>AB 2383</b>		
Dymally	Requires HIV testing for all inmates entering a correctional facility for incarceration for a period of at least one year, for persons entering a state prison or a state hospital housing patients, committed pursuant to existing provisions of law. Requires that if the inmate's HIV test results are positive, the chief medical officer shall notify the inmate's parole officer for mandatory referral to a county PCRS program.
